Held in March 2019, the Jeftomson Careers Showcase featured a tour of high-tech orchards, packing operations and a transport distribution centre.

It was designed to showcase the fourth largest business in Greater Shepparton and highlight the job diversity and career pathways within the business. It involved 71 students and 12 teachers.
